Treasurer's Report

- Cheques have not been cashed except BCCPAC and dry grad contribution
- The budget is balanced and there may be a slight carryover,
- Treasurer can now apply for grants and will do so in the next two weeks although we have until June
- S. Deane sent PAC an email regarding the annual PAC donation towards a scholarship, we have previously budgeted \$1000 - PAC will send funds to cover 2 scholarships at \$500 each

DPAC update: Nancy Baily

- "Is that legal?" presentation at last meeting, received a hand out from legal services society (Gr 8 White Hatter session talks about what is legal online and the school uses older mentors with Gr 8 as it is often more valuable for kids to hear it from an older student than an adult)
- Update on school budget, \$160 mil budget with no reductions, surplus of 63,000
- 90% of the budget is staffing
- Ministry increased funding by \$45 per student, also significant increase in inclusive learning funding, details can be found on the District site.
