Midterm Report Cards and MyEd

Midterms Report Cards are now available for viewing on MyEd. For more information, please refer to the email that was sent to you on Thursday. If you have any concerns about your student's progress, please contact the teacher directly via email. If there are problems loging in, please contact the office for some help – we cannot give out passwords but they can be reset.

Only quarter classes are being reported on at this time. For semester classes, you should receive an informal interim if your student is struggling or has a mark below 60%. For linear classes, your first report won't be until November 25, end of Quarter 1. Parents, at any time, you are encouraged to contact teachers if you are seeking information on the progress of your student.

Student Fees

Student fees and deposits will be assessed for all classes prior to October 19 (new date). Some fees are being reduced to reflect the reality of COVID and that some opportunities will not be available to students. We are encouraging families to use the online feature in Parent Connect to pay – see attached. If families want to pay by cash or cheques they can do so on October 19 – Fee Day. We know Grade 12 is an exciting time in students' lives and they are keen to celebrate the wonderful milestone of graduation. We will be engaging with our Grad Committee members early in the school year to begin to discuss and plan how best to celebrate Grad 2021 given that we may still be subject to COVID-19 health and safety restrictions next year. There is no question there is a great deal of uncertainty with respect to what types of events will be permitted in Spring of 2021. As such, we will be keeping in touch with Health Authorities for updates on restrictions for any type of events and gatherings as we plan for grad events. Despite a great deal of uncertainty with what June 2021 will look like, we still want to ensure that we don't lose out on the opportunity to secure potential venues, and other important details for grad events. Given this, we feel it is prudent to move ahead with the collection of grad fees at this time. We will adapt and adjust Grad events due to COVID restrictions as required and if events cannot go ahead, or need to be re-organized, refunds will be provided.
