Dear Families and Students,

This week featured the end of Quarter 2 and the start of Quarter 3. Students and staff are quickly transitioning to new classes to start a new experience. As we hear more about the three new strains (UK, South Africa and Brazil) of COVID-19 being more easily transmissible and virulent, we must remain vigilant and REALLY ADHERE to the protocols that keep us and our families safe. Vaccines are on the way but we don't want anyone to get sick while we are waiting. Based on the information I have seen, the general public are not likely to get vaccines until the summer at the earliest. Keep up the good work up, stay safe and healthy.

The Ministry of Health and Education announced Updates to the Provincial Health and Safety Guidelines for K-12 School Settings on February 4. Please refer to the email that you received from Doug Sheppard, Superintendent of Schools for Delta - <https://www.deltasd.bc.ca/news-events/news/information-for-parents-guardians-novel-coronavirus/>. Below are some highlights of the changes:

Non-medical masks are now required for all staff in all K-12 schools, and all students in our secondary schools in all indoor areas, including when they are in their learning groups. The only exceptions are when:

- They are sitting or standing at their seat or workstation in a classroom
- They are eating or drinking
- There is a barrier in place

Mask exemptions remain in place for students and staff who cannot wear a mask for health or behavioural reasons.

Masks are not a replacement for physical distancing, be as distant from others as much as possible all the times.

Even when wearing a mask, staff and students will still be required to maintain physical distance from people outside of their learning group.

Sands is in a great position as the changes that are required are largely already in place. There are some areas that we need to make some changes and will be doing that immediately.

Reminder, that the school doors do not open until 8:20 in the morning. We would like students to avoid crowding under the covered area. Please don't drop your student off until 8:20am or ask them not to arrive until 8:20am.

### **Quarter 3**

If your student is in a Hybrid class, then they will attend face to face either on Monday/Thursday or Tuesday/Friday. Wednesday is a remote learning day, except for PE 11/12 and Fit for Life. Teachers will assign work and learning to be completed on the days they are not attending face to face. Teachers have posted lists outside their classroom with a break-down of who is coming on which days. It is also my understanding they will be emailing students to let them know. Hybrid classes are multi-cohorted classes and masks are mandatory for students.

- Try to keep at least 2 metres from people outside of your household
