- Staffing
  - We have 1 vacant Math position and we are in the process of interviewing candidates.
  - Our school population is at 724 students
- We will be having a Grade 11 & 12 Assembly during Flex Time (9:50AM) in the Gym on Thursday, September 22nd to discuss everything graduation related.
- Grade 8 Transition
  - August BBQ- Invited students and families to a community barbeque to reduce stress and anxiety over the first day of high school.
  - Games Day Fridays
  - Mentorship Meetings each grade 8 student will be in a small group with a senior mentor who will answer questions and facilitate discussions on various topics throughout the school year.
  - Grade 8 Assembly on Monday, September 26th on inclusion and acceptance with everyone's differences.
  - Grade 8 Retreat students have a day to meet their peers, to experience team building activities and to develop strategies to help them navigate the high school culture.

#### Grad Boat Cruise

Ticket sales will take place next week starting on Tuesday, September 20th at lunch. Tickets will be \$115.00 which includes transportation to and from Coal Harbour, a buffet dinner, a 3-hour boat tour and a DJ for dancing. Payment can be made in cash, by cheque (made payable to Sands Secondary School) or by debit/credit. Grade 12 students will be required to have submitted their Field Trip Consent form and their Code of Conduct Agreement prior to purchasing a ticket. Students will arrive at the front of the school by 4:15pm to meet the buses. The buses will leave the school at 4:30pm to Coal Harbour. The ship will depart Coal Harbour at 5:30pm. Students will return to Sands Secondary by 9:30pm.

#### Mental Health School Goal

- As a school, we will be investigating how to best support the student's mental health wellness. A number of staff members have been trained in the Teen Mental Health Curriculum. We want our students to be informed about the feelings they are experiencing and strategies of how to cope through those feelings
- Has PAC had a presentation on the Mental Health Curriculum? Answer is no.
- Emergency Preparedness Bin:
  - Water and food have been ordered and should arrive soon
  - Vanessa Heal will be circulating a contents list to school for their bins
  - Ms. Macintosh will be setting up a meeting with PAC reps to ensure our bin is well stocked.

### Parent Workshops:

"Help for the Hard Times" workshops are designed to support parents/caregivers whose child has had an inpatient stay or has had ER visits due to a mental health or substance use concern. As parents ourselves, we know how difficult it can be to support a child after a mental health crisis and we want to help. Safer Schools: "The Modern-Day Predator" was designed to provide education to

Parents/Caregivers, School Administrators and Community Partners as a means for the prevention of sexual exploitation. This session provides tools to address issues like consent, creating healthy boundaries and grooming both online and in person The event takes place on September 28, 2022, from 7-9pm and is \$29 a person.
