## Principal's Update

- Early Dismissal on Friday: Students will be dismissed at 1:00 pm this Friday for teachers to prepare for the upcoming Mid-Semester Report Cards that will be available on May 1. Students will have 1-hour classes with a 20-minute Nutrition Break.
- May 9 will be Teachers and Parents Meetings.
- Delta Summer School Program: Every year, the Delta School District offers a variety of Summer School classes for students for either remediating a class that they did not pass or taking a completion course. The Delta School District has now opened registrations for students and families for the Summer of 2023. I would encourage students to contact their Grade Counsellor for advice on the potential courses to take over the Summer. The Summer School offerings in Delta can be found in the link below. Space is limited and we recommend that students register as soon as possible.

- Semester Schedule: The decision to maintain a semester schedule next year with more linear courses being offered to provide students with opportunities to experience yearlong classes, like with support blocks, has raised some questions from families about the Hybrid Schedule model. Students will have the same experience with the schedule as they had this year with more linear (full-year) course options. There will be a rotation between A1 and A2 Blocks per day.
- Brooke Elementary 50-Year Anniversary: On Friday, May 5th, Brooke Elementary will be hosting a celebration to commemorate its 50 year anniversary. All former Brooke Elementary students and families are welcome to attend this celebration which will take place from 4:00-7:00 pm. There will be a meet and greet, a cake presentation, a Lions BBQ and PAC concession, Zumba classes, and much more. The Brooke Elementary students and staff hope for a large turnout to help them celebrate this milestone.

- Student Learning Survey: During the months of February to April, Delta School District is
  participating in the 2023 Ministry of Education Electronic Anonymous Student Learning
  Survey in cooperation with all other school districts throughout the Province. Students
  in Grades 10 and 12 will be completing the survey in April. Parents/guardians can
  complete the online anonymous Student Learning Survey to confirm the effectiveness of
  learning at Sands High before midnight April 29, 2023.
- Dry Grad 2023: The Delta North Dry Grad Event includes the graduating classes of Burnsview, Delview, North Delta, and Sands, and will take place at the North Delta Recreation Centre from 11:30pm Friday, May 26, 2023 5:00am Saturday, May 27, 2023. To support and celebrate the success of the 2023 Delta North graduating classes in the safest way possible, a volunteer committee of parents is planning the annual Dry Grad event. The Dry Grad event happens after the school's graduation banquet. Graduates will enjoy a night of fun, food, prizes, and entertainment in the company of their graduating friends. Dry Grad allows the graduates to celebrate in a safe and fun environment, with the activities going until the wee hours of the morning! The event ends at 5:00am on Saturday, May 27, 2023. There will be AMAZING prizes, GREAT food,

and ENDLESS entertainment! Tickets will be sold during lunch in the foyer of each school on the following dates only: April 20: Last Chance Tickets \$55

Tickets can be purchased by cash or cheque payable to "Delta North Dry Grad Committee"

- Grad Red Carpet & Dinner & Dance: In conjunction with Grad Council, we will be following the same format as students experienced in the past. The only change to the students' experience is that students will be bussed to the dinner venue and back instead of getting to the venue on their own. This step is to reduce any risks of poor decisions being made. Students will be bussed back to the school where they will drop off their formal clothes, then the buses will take them to the North Delta Recreation Centre. We are also going to be subsidizing the ticket price by using our Affordability Grant to offset costs to students and families.
- Relay for Life Canadian Cancer Society Fundraising: Student Council is organizing a
  Relay for Life event in mid June as a fundraiser to donate funds to the Canadian Cancer
  Society. The Student Council will launch this endeavor with a schoolwide assembly on
  Monday, May 1 st during Flex Time. There will even be some students shaving their
  heads for donations. The fundraiser has students continuously running for a period and
  sponsors donate according to the number of kilometers the students run.
