

English 10 Options

▶ Creative Writing:

- ~designed for students who want to develop skills written communication
- ~study authors and texts
- ~develop writing skills through the process of drafting, reflecting, and revising to build a body of work

Literary Studies:

~designed for students interested in the literature of a variety of eras, geographical areas or themes, or in the study of literature in general ~allows students to explore specific themes, periods, authors, or areas of the world through works in a variety of media

New Media:

- ~designed to reflect the changing role of technology in today's society and the increasing importance of digital media in communicating and exchanging ideas
- ~possible additional focus areas of study include: media and film studies, journalism and publishing, and digital communication

English 10 Options

Debate:

- ~designed for students who are interested in exploring English through the lens of debate
- ~in addition to studying the traditional genres of fiction an non-fiction, students will focus on the Spoken Language Core Competencies and apply them in developing argumentation skills
- ~emphasis on developing persuasive arguments and additional focus is given to the verbal presentation of arguments that is central to debate

Pre-AP (Advanced Placement) English:

~develops reading, writing, speaking, and critical thinking skills by examining a wide range of challenging novels, plays, short stories and poems from across eras

and cultures

- ~while covering the same curriculum as Literary Studies, this cohort further develops reading, writing, speaking, and critical thinking skills by examining a wide range of challenging novels, plays, short stories, and poems.
- ~while the assessment criteria is the same as any other English cohort, the Pre-AP cohort tends to move at a slightly faster pace.

MATHEMATICS

The math curriculum includes 3 available pathways for students. The three pathways available are: Apprenticeship and Workplace Mathematics, Foundations of Mathematics, and Pre-Calculus. At the grade 10 level, a common Foundations of Mathematics and Pre-Calculus course is the starting point for both the Foundations of Mathematics and Pre-Calculus pathways. When choosing a pathway, students should consider their interests, both current and future. Students and parents are encouraged to research the admission requirements for post-secondary programs of study as they vary by institution and by year.

Implications of Math



- Any Math 11 course will graduate a student from high school with a Dogwood certificate.
- Post-secondary Math needs will vary by faculty. Please be informed, and keep viable options open.
- In Gr 11 students will commit to a stream of math to continue on in.

 le. Workplace, Foundations, or Pre-Calculus
 - *Students in Practical Math 8 will move to Practical Math 9
 - *Students in Practical Math 9 will move into Workplace Math 10

**To move out of Practical or Workplace into regular stream, it is required that the student successfully complete the previous grade level, or move forward with support (tutor). le. Completion of WP 10 with 90%+ = try Foundations 11.

What About a Language?



Students may earn credits towards graduation through training programs outside of school:

- Dance (ie. Royal Academy of Dance)
- Music (ie. Royal Conservatory of Music)
- Sports (Provincial or National team level)
- Lifesaving (Bronze Cross, NLS, Instructor)
- Cadets (National Defense Cadet Certification)
- Driver Ed (ICBC accredited program)
- Credits vary and must meet Gr 10-12 criteria
- Students are asked to bring documentation as proof of credit

Remedial

- For Gr 8 & 9 students who need to repeat an academic course
- Must have achieved 40% +
- 3 weeks in July
- ▶ 2 ½ hour class
- English 9, Socials 9,Math 9, Science 9
 - = take a '<u>Skill Building'</u> class

Full-Credit

- For those students who want to complete a Gr 10 or 11 course ahead of schedule
- ▶ 4 weeks in July/Aug
- ▶ 3 ½ hour class

- 2 class maximum
