## English 10 Options

- Debate:

-emphasis on developing persuas sive arguments and additional focus is given to the verbal presentation of arguments that is central to debate
- Pre-AP (Advanced Placement) English:
-develops reading, writing, speaking, and critical thinking skills by examining a wide range of challenging novels, plays, short stones and poems from across eras
and cultures
while covering the same curic ulum as Literary Studies, this c ohort further develops reading, writing, speaking, and critic al thinking skills by examining a wide range of challenging novels, plays, short stories, and poems.
~while the assessment criteria is the same as any other English cohort, the Pre-AP cohort tends to move at a slightly faster pace.

## MATHEMATICS

The math curriculum includes 3 available pathways for students. The three pathways available are: Apprenticeship and Workplace Mathematics, Foundations of Mathematics, and Pre-Calculus. At the grade 10 level, a common Foundations of Mathematics and Pre-Calculus course is the starting point for both the Foundations of Mathematics and Pre-Calculus pathways. When choosing a pathway, students should consider their interests, both current and future. Students and parents are encouraged to research the admission requirements for post-secondary programs of study as they vary by institution and by year.

*Students in Practical Math 8 will move to Practical Math 9 *Students in Practical Math 9 will move into Workplace Math 10
*To move out of Practical or Workplace into regular stream, it is required that the student suc cessfully complete the previous grade level, or move forward with support (tutor). le. Completion of WP 10 with $90 \%+=$ try Foundations 11.
